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Upcycle Your Life

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People often forget that reusing is one of the three Rs: reduce, reuse, and recycle. These days, another word for "reuse" is "upcycle." To upcycle means to make something brand-new out of old products, like using an old T-shirt to make a new piece of upcycled fashion. This saves your T-shirt from going into the waste stream, saves you money on the fashion you needed, and gets you something cool and brand-new.

Upcycling is one of our many passions here at Hearts – we *love* the creative process. Enjoy these ideas for greener, refashioning!

Quick Facts: Textile Waste

- 7 pounds CO2, 700 gallons of water+ wasted: Every time you throw out a T-shirt, that represents 7 pounds of CO2, 700 gallons of water, one-third of a pound of pesticides, and a whole lot of cotton.[i] That's a lot of wasted natural resources.
- 3 years average life of clothing: The average lifetime of most articles of clothing is just three years with most tossed rather than donated or recycled. Out of all the garbage thrown out each year, approximately 5.3% of it is textiles. [iii]
- 3-5% of all landfill space saved with textile recycling: 2.5 billion pounds of textiles 10 pounds per person are recycled annually. If everyone donated, upcycled, or recycled their old T-shirts, it would mean 3-5% of all garbage would be re-directed from landfills.[iv]
- 17,000 textile recycling jobs in the US: There are more than 500 textile recycling companies that employ about 17,000 workers in the United States. [V]
- 210 billion gallons of water: That's how much would be saved if 300 million Americans recycled just one T-shirt.[vi] T-shirts that are not in a condition to sell or donate get turned into rags or form a component of high-quality paper. [vii]

Take Action! Transform Your Own T-Shirts



- 1. **T-Shirt upcycling ideas:** Some things that can be made from old T-shirts: a messenger bag, fabric rosettes for embellishing, ruffled pillows, reusable shopping bags, braided bracelets or necklaces, quilts, dog tug toys, a no-sew scarf, and a "teekini." - 2. **Upcycle T-shirts in community:** Host an upcycling get together by getting together with a group to work on your projects together to share inspiration and make it fun. Or combine it with charity: have everyone bring their own old T-shirts and whatever else they will need to make their desired item they will donate for a good cause. You could even get together and make quilts for homeless shelters, or to sell at a craft sale, and then donate the profits.
- 3. **Donate T-Shirts to those in need:** If you don't want to upcycle, donate your T-shirts that are still in good, wearable condition (and probably other clothing, too) to people in need. Open Arms donates them to new immigrants who escaped from oppression, violence, or persecution in their homelands (bulk donations are best). ClothingDonations.org gives them to veterans and their families and DoSomething.org to homeless shelters. The Red Cross takes donated items and uses them in disaster relief in the United States. The Salvation Army also accepts clothing donations to help outfit those living in poverty.
- 4. Recycle the scraps you don't need: Call your local textile recycle company to see if they'll take scraps. Otherwise, you can cut them into strips and use them to tie up plants in your garden; stuff rag dolls or small pillows with the scraps; cut larger pieces into wash cloths for friends who cloth diaper; donate scraps to your local preschool or daycare center for use in crafts; or cut them into long thin strips and crochet rag rugs with the pieces.
