Quick Facts: Common Powdered Laundry Detergents

- Acetone: This common chemical is connected with kidney and liver damage, harm to fetuses in the womb, and skin and eye irritation.
- Sodium laureth sulfate: This is a potential cancer-causer and will irritate your eyes and skin.
- Sodium hypochlorite (bleach): Avoid bleach to create a green, healthier household.
- 1,4 dioxane: This chemical is linked to kidney, liver, blood, nervous system, and skin toxicity.

DIY Green Cleaning Recipes for Powdered Laundry Detergent

- 1. Borax, washing soda, baking soda, and castile soap powdered laundry detergent: Grate 2 bars of castile soap and put in a large container. Add 1 cup baking soda, 1 cup washing soda crystals, and 1 cup borax. Mix with a large spoon or spatula. Break up any clumps with hands. Use 1/4 cup per load.
- Castile soap, borax, and washing soda powdered laundry detergent: Grate 1 bar of castile soap into a container. Add 1 cup washing soda crystals and 1 cup borax. Stir to blend, breaking up any clumps with hands. Use 1/4 cup per load.
- Baking soda, borax, and castile soap powdered laundry detergent. Grate 2 bars of castile soap into a large container. Add 1 box (16 oz.) baking soda, and 2 cups borax. Mix to blend; break up any large clumps with your fingers. Use 1/4 cup per load.

4. **Vinegar, baking soda, castile soap, and washing soda powdered laundry detergent.** Pour 1/4 cup liquid castile soap into a bowl. Add 1 1/2 cups each baking soda and washing soda crystals and blend. Measure 1 cup white vinegar and slowly add to other ingredients. It will bubble, and the mix will become powdered after stirring for several minutes. Use 1/3 cup per load.
